She was part of the golden era of the council, the 1970s and 1980s, when it was full of heft. She doggedly led the way in acquiring stunning Kubota Gardens in South Seattle and also was a player in the creation of Magnuson Park

Mrs. Williams was a champion of good government serving on the Seattle City Council for 20 years. She was a public servant who worked tirelessly on everything and introduced early legislation to prohibit discrimination in employment and housing for gays and lesbians.

This reform-minded council member made things happen. She will be sorely missed.
