

Denny Middle School to Become an International School

Denny Middle School has a beautifully diverse student population, representing many races, cultures, religions, and linguistics groups from around the world. Over one-third of our students are bilingual and our English Language Learning population is growing. The International School model is not only a perfect fit for our demographics, but it is also what our children need educationally.

All of us at Denny want our curricular and instructional efforts to provide rigor and to challenge the students we serve. Our students are smart, capable and can become leaders in the global

community that they will enter as adults.
