YOUR COMMUNITY CENTER ADVISORY COUNCIL

Most classes, workshops, sports programs, special events and facility rentals are funded through the local advisory council, rather than from City of Seattle budgets. Revenues generated through program fees offset program costs to make these activities self-sustaining. We also rely on participation, donations, and contributions to maintain and upgrade equipment. Advisory council members create scholarship opportunities through grant writing and other fundraising activities.

Join Us! Citizen direction and participation is essential to our success. Monthly meetings are held to talk about programs, policies, and financial issues. GET SET, READY, GO! PROGRAM REGISTRATION

Online registration (SPARC) begins May 26 at noon for community centers, pools, and the Lifelong Recreation programs. A barcode and PIN are needed to register online. To obtain these login numbers, visit seattle. gov/parks, click SPARC, and follow the instructions. Allow one week for new account requests.

Walk-in and phone-in registration also begins May 26 during operation hours at all Environmental Learning Centers.

Mail-in registration for community centers and Lifelong Recreation programs is accepted beginning May 26 (no mail-in registration for pools). These registrations will not be processed prior to this date.

As part of the Climate Action Now (CAN) initiative, Seattle Parks and Recreation is encouraging Seattle citizens and visitors to examine their lifestyles and make changes to improve the health of our planet and all those who live here.

At Environmental Learning Centers (ELCs) around the city (Camp Long, Carkeek Park and Discovery Park), we offer programs that provide recreational opportunities that leave no, or little, carbon footprint, such as guided bicycle rides and

free walks. We also offer programs that can help you figure out what a carbon footprint is and offer suggestions for change. Look to Seattle parks this summer for fun, healthy recreational opportunities. Do things close to home rather than driving long distances for your recreation. Let this be the summer you truly lessen your carbon footprint.

Remember, if you want to drive even less, you can get to every ELC on a bus. Routes #33 and #24 serve Discovery Park. Routes #75 and #28 serve Carkeek Park. Route #21 goes to Camp Long. You can plan any bus trip at www.kingcounty.gov/tripplanner/.

Go outside and play this summer! Go for a walk or ride a bike. Give your car some time off. Walk to your local green space or park and have a picnic rather than drive far away from home. Celebrate where you live and support local businesses. There's a lot for you to do in your Seattle parks.

Parks is Working to Reduce Our Fuel Use

Seattle Parks has set a goal of reducing our fuel use by 10% compared to what we used in 2007. We plan to make this reduction in a number of ways, including: adjusting work routes, reducing vehicle idling, maintaining proper tire pressures, carrying less equipment in our vehicles, and improving the efficiency of our small equipment such as mowers and blowers. We are making good progress. In 2008 we reduced our fuel use by 5% compared to the previous year.

Seattle Parks has also begun to look at the long-term potential to reduce fuel use. We are closely examining our vehicle purchases to make sure the most efficient vehicles are purchased for the job. We are also looking at the potential for other technologies to substitute for fuel use, such as examining electric carts to replace the current gas carts at our golf courses.






CAMP LONG

Arts in Nature Festival

This is a family-friendly, multidisciplinary event produced by Nature Consortium encompassing an innovative mix of traditional, eclectic, experimental & adaptive music and art forms. There will be dance, music, theatre, fire performances, wandering performances, hands-on art activities and an outdoor "museum of sound" consisting of installations blending sound, auditory arts, music and visual arts inside the park's rustic cabins, which meander through the forested outer perimeter of the park. Fest attendees have the opportunity to enter and explore each cabin. Performances are acoustic & take place in 5 different venues throughout the park: the Lodge, a forested grove by the Pond, on the climbing Glacier, in the Meadow, and in a Geodesic Dome. There will be a wide array of eclectic and traditional music offerings ranging from experimental and improvised to early music, classical, world, jazz and folk. Dance troupes will perform in various locations throughout the park, and wandering musicians and performers are

encouraged to roam the forested landscape. There will be an interactive arts area where attendees can create Eco-Art projects such as Instruments from Recyclables & Found Objects, Leaf Printing, Mask Making and naturalist activities. 

Payment

You can pay for classes and other activities by mail, in person during regular facility hours, or by telephone with a credit card or online while registering. We accept Visa, MasterCard and American Express. Please make checks and money orders out to City of Seattle. PLEASE NOTE: Payment is due when you register, unless we have indicated otherwise. If your check is returned for insufficient funds, your registration will be cancelled until you pay the amount due, plus a \$20 fee. (Credit card or cash only.)

Fees and charges

Our Advisory Council provides the programs and activities listed in this brochure under an agreement with Seattle Parks and Recreation. Fees collected by the Advisory Council are used to offset the cost of providing the programs. Program charges include a user fee paid to Seattle Parks and Recreation to defray operating costs. Class and program fees include Washington State sales tax where applicable.

Confirmations

Sorry, we cannot confirm class registration by mail or phone, but we will notify you by phone if your class is postponed or cancelled

Class cancellations

To cover the cost of providing a program, we need a specific number of participants. If too few people sign up for a class, we must cancel it. We'll notify you (at the latest) one or two days before the class start date. When possible, we will postpone a class for a week to allow for more enrollments; if the class minimum is not met by then, we will have to cancel it.

Waiting lists

We will create waiting lists for all filled classes. Please be sure to sign up if you are interested in a class that is full, because class openings often become available. If demand is high, we will try to form another class. Please contact us for space availability.

Scholarships

Our Advisory Council wants to ensure that our activities, classes and sports are available to everyone, regardless of their ability to pay. The Council may choose to offer scholarships for qualified applicants. To apply for a scholarship, please talk to a member of our staff.

Refund Information

It is the policy of Seattle Parks and Recreation and the Associated Recreation Council that: –Anyone who registers for a class, camp, special event or program that is cancelled for any reason by Parks and Recreation or the Advisory Council will receive a full refund.

- -Anyone who registers for a class, lesson, day camp, trip, overnight camp, special event, or facility rental, and who requests a refund 14 days or more before its start (or before the second session of a class), may receive a refund minus a service charge.
- -Anyone who registers for a class, lesson, day camp, trip, overnight camp, special event, or facility rental, and who withdraws from the activity fewer than 14 days before its start (or after the second session of a class), will receive no refund.
- -If a participant drops a class for which he or she is registered prior to the second session of a series, the course will be refunded less \$5 or 10% of the fee (whichever is greater). If a participant drops a class for which he or she is registered after the second session of a series, the course will not be refunded. Please read the entire policy, #7.16, for specific information.


