King County is inviting qualified individuals to become members of a Design Advisory Group to shape how new stormwater and wastewater infrastructure near Lowman Beach Park can become a West Seattle asset.



King County plans to design and build an underground storage tank across the street from Lowman Beach Park. Today, when heavy rains exceed the capacity of Murray Pump Station, excess stormwater and sewage flow directly into Puget Sound. These events, called combined sewer overflows (CSOs), help to avoid sewer backups into homes and businesses and onto streets, but they are a public health and environmental concern. The new underground storage tank will reduce CSOs near Lowman Beach Park by temporarily storing excess wastewater and stormwater.

King County needs your help designing a facility that fits with the local neighborhood and reflects community values.
