Emergency repair work at Murray CSO Control project site July 18-19

King County's contractor will fix the crane boom at the Murray CSO Control Facility project site this Saturday and Sunday. The boom is critical equipment for the tank construction. Repairing it over the weekend will ensure the project can continue working on finishing the tank during the week of July 20. Work on both weekend days will begin at 9 a.m. as required by permit.

The site will be busier and noisier this weekend than on a typical weekend.

Repairing the boom will require two or three mechanics to be on site with one or two service trucks supporting them. The mechanics will use air compressors and tools using compressed air to make the repairs.

To stay safe, please avoid the site, the east side of Beach Dr. S.W. and engaging workers.

- Noise from repair equipment
 including air compressors
