





Fauntleroy ferry terminal pavement maintenance and preservation begins 7 p.m. Monday, April 9

Washington State Ferries (WSF) and its contractor, C.A. Carey, will be conducting maintenance work to preserve the Fauntleroy Ferry Terminal by re-paving the dock and approach, re-striping the lanes, and adding fencing along the pedestrian walkway. In an effort to complete this work before the busy summer season and during less-busy ferry travel times, nighttime work will begin on April 9.

Why is WSF re-paving the Fauntleroy dock?

- The pavement is deteriorating due to age and needs to be replaced.
- The work must occur every 7-10 years.
- The asphalt helps preserve the timber decking and piles that support the dock.

What can I expect?

- Work will include grinding, chipping, and paving and will require the use of trucks and large machinery.
- Neighbors can expect noise during some phases of the work.
- Crews will implement construction best practices to limit noise levels, when possible.

When will the work occur?

- Work will take place from 7 p.m. 4 a.m. from April 9 until the end of May.
- No work will be conducted Friday-Sunday nights.
