VFW announces \$30,000 scholarship competition

Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 2713, in West Seattle, announces the kick-off of this year's VFW's Voice of Democracy Scholarship competition. **Students in grades 9-12** have the opportunity to compete for thousands of dollars in scholarships and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Students must write and record a three-to-five minute essay on the selected theme using an audio CD or flash drive and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to their local VFW Post by Oct. 31, 2018. The 2018-19 theme is: "Why My Vote Matters". Students begin by competing at the local Post level, Post winners compete at the District level with the winner advancing to the state competition.

All state first-place winners receive a four day trip to Washington, D.C., and the chance to compete for their share of more than \$150,000 in scholarships. The first-place winner receives a \$30,000 college scholarship.

Each year more than 132,000 students in **grades 6-8** enter the VFW's **Patriot's Pen** essay contest. The national first-place winner wins \$5,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C. The first-place winner from each state competes for national awards totaling \$55,000, with each first-place state winner receiving a minimum of \$500 at the national level.

The essay contest encourages young minds to examine America's history, along with their own experiences in modern American society, by drafting a 300- to 400-word essay, expressing their views based on a patriotic theme. The 2018-19 theme is: "Why I Honor the American Flag".

Each grade winner not in top 3 will receive \$50, \$40, and \$30 respectively.

Since this program is completely voluntary, a student (including home schooled) does not have to go through their school to participate.
