
## Your thoughts matter






## H Line timeline

2016 2017

► Identify corridors for upgrade to RapidRide service (in METRO CONNECTS, Metro's long range plan)

2017

Partner with local jurisdictions to create the H Line

2017 2018

- Evaluate existing conditions
- Analyze environmental
- Research H Line options and their potential impacts
- Gather public input on community needs and priorities
- Gather public input on routing and stops
- Identify opportunities to improve transit speed, reliability, and service
- Choose routing and stops

2018 2019

- Advance design work
- Gather public input on preferred concepts and final design
- Plan construction

2020 2021

- Finalize project partner agreements
- Build infrastructure for H Line

- Easy to use
- Fast, frequent, and reliable
- Buses come so often, you don't need a schedule
- Faster boarding
- Move more, stop less
- Better safety and security
- Intelligent transportation systems
- Innovative buses (inside and out)

## RapidRide features

#### Convenient and easy to use

- Service that starts early and runs late, every day
- Buses come at least every 10 minutes during busiest hours
- Off-board ORCA payment at stations allows boarding at any door
- Riders with mobility aids can secure themselves easily

#### Safe and smart

- Stations have real-time arrival signs
- Transit signal priority synchronizes traffic lights with buses
- Shelters are well lit, and all buses have security cameras

#### Move more, stop less

- ► H Line stops are about 1/3 mile apart—closer together than typical RapidRide routes
- Stop consolidation helps speed up your ride
- Street and traffic improvements make it easier to get to/from the bus

## H Line overview


#### What's happening

- New H Line routing in Burien
- We've consolidated and added stops
- We've made safety improvements such as adding crosswalks and lighting
- Buses will get priority signals at certain intersections
- Buses will have bus-only lanes for parts of the route
- Roadway pavement repairs

- Pedestrian safety improvements

- Routing to provide better access to downtown Burien and the Burien Transit Center
- Easier ways to transfer between local buses and RapidRide lines at Burien Transit Center







- Pedestrian safety improvements

- Better connection to future light rail
- Roadway pavement repairs
- Business access and transit lanes (BAT Lanes)
- Protected bike lanes and neighborhood greenway connections
- Signal upgrades
- Water and sewer pipe upgrades
- Spot parking and bike lane removal
- Public art
- Easier transfers between local buses and RapidRide lines at Westwood Village

#### In the Delridge corridor, SDOT is proposing:

- Bus lanes
- Landscaped medians
- Crosswalk improvements
- Protected bike lanes and neighborhood greenway connections
- Signal upgrades
- Paving
- Water and sewer pipe upgrades
- Spot parking and bike lane removal
- Public art


