Next Steps

- WSF will finalize the schedule by the end of December. The new sailing schedule will start on March 31, 2019.
- WSF will continue to work with transit partners to align their schedules with the new ferry sailing schedule.
- Once the weekday schedule is final, WSF will develop a new emergency two-boat schedule and make minor adjustments to the weekend schedule.
- Fauntleroy terminal reconstruction is scheduled for 2025-2027. Planning and environmental review will begin in early-2019 and will include a robust community engagement process to determine the best way to address terminal inefficiencies and needs.

Sailing Schedule Revision

Fauntleroy/Vashon/Southworth

Summary

Starting March 31, 2019, the Fauntleroy/Vashon Island/Southworth route, also known as the "Triangle" route, will operate on a new schedule. Not only is a schedule update long overdue—the current schedule hasn't received a significant overhaul in 15 years!—but it is also critical to maintaining reliable service. WSF is adding a third Issaquah Class vessel to the route that holds approximately 124 vehicles. A larger ferry will help move more people and goods across Puget Sound, while the new schedule will help make loading more orderly at the Fauntleroy terminal and improve overall service reliability for our customers.

How does the new schedule benefit ferry riders?

- Adding a bigger ferry adds capacity to the growing route.
- More loading/unloading time time built into the schedule to improve reliability and allow time to fill the boats.
- Helps WSF meet the changing needs of all three communities.
- Revises departure times to better meet customer travel needs.

HOW did the public help shape the new sailing schedule?

This change is part of a two-year community process to improve service reliability on this route and ease congestion at Fauntleroy. WSF examined ridership statistics, travel patterns, user schedules, crew schedules, capacity, and sailing/loading times.

WSF values the unique perspectives of all customers, and we gathered input from ridership groups, business owners, government agencies, and individuals across each community. Over the last year, WSF reviewed close to 800 comments on priorities to consider when developing a new Fauntleroy/Vashon/Southworth schedule.
