










Level 1 alternatives - West Seattle and Duwamish






Level 1 alternatives - West Seattle and Duwamish





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Sound Transit Board Motion (May 2019)

- The Board identified preferred alternatives and other alternatives for study in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement.
- "The Board directs staff to conduct an initial assessment of the following alternatives, which were suggested during the scoping period, to establish whether further detailed study in the Draft EIS is appropriate:
 - Yancy/Andover alignment an alignment along the Yancy/Andover corridor with a Delridge Station serving Youngstown."















Preferred Alternative with Third Party Funding



Draft EIS alternatives Delridge







Or, "EIS" for short.


Provides agencies and the public an understanding of environmental consequences and assists in decision-making.



Equity and inclusion

Environmental justice focus within each area of the EIS





Environmental justice

- ✓ Describes demographics
- ✓ Evaluates whether project disproportionately impacts minority and low-income communities
- Considers potential project benefits such as improved access to opportunity
- ✓ Documents what we hear from outreach efforts

Acquisition / relocation process



Before DEIS publication (late 2020)

Sound Transit contacts potentially affected property owners



During final design (2022-2026)*

- Sound Transit identifies full / partial acquisitions
- Sound Transit Board authorizes property purchases



After DEIS publication (mid 2021)

Sound Transit Board confirms or modifies preferred alternative



After FEIS publication (2022)

Sound Transit Board selects project to be built

- Sound Transit will prepare an appraisal to determine fair market value of property needed for the project
- Sound Transit will provide full relocation services to people and businesses displaced by the project, including referrals to comparable properties and payment of moving costs
- Sound Transit staff are available to support property owners and tenants through this process



Ballard and downtown Seattle Light Rail Tunnel: Design is expected to begin in 2023 and be completed in 2026.


