We're working to calm traffic in your neighborhood and keep kids walking and biking to Arbor Heights Elementary and Westside Schools safe by adding speed humps on all streets that are signed with a 20 mph school speed zone. This includes SW 104th St, SW 105th St, 32nd Ave SW, 33rd Ave SW, 34th Ave SW, 35th Ave SW, 36th Ave SW, 37th Ave SW, 37th Pl SW, 38th Ave SW, and 39th Ave SW.

Speed humps decrease the speeds of people driving to under the neighborhood speed limit – 20 mph. Across the city, we want to increase the number of kids who walk and bike to school.

We plan to install speed humps this spring. Prior to construction, you may see the speed hump locations marked on the street. Look for no parking signs at least 3 days before construction, which takes about 2 days.
