Recess > Parks Boulevard, Alki Playground and Playfield



School Traffic Safety Committee Best Practice Guidelines

- > Locate school entrances near safe places to walk across the street
- > Allocate space to education and community, not private car infrastructure
- > Preschool drop-off areas should be safe and convenient for all users
- > Bicycle access should be convenient
- > Locate school bus loading separate from the parent pick-up area



A Welcoming Building...


- >Is less hierarchical than everyday space in society
- >Acknowledges that **Seattle Public Schools sits**on the traditional Native land of the Coast Salish
 people past and present
- >Presents an entry point that **feels like an open door**
- >Encourages families and community members to share stories, information, and personal experiences
- >Communicates "racial microaffirmations" and other affirmations that explicitly welcome BIPOC communities, LGBTQ+ communities and other communities furthest from educational justice

- >Demarginalizes the often **stigmatized programs**, **services**, **and resources** designed for students and families furthest from educational justice
- >Delinks gender and toilets
- >Provides **universal access** on shared pathways
- >Acknowledges and affirms differentiated learning
- >Encourages small group, individual engagement within playgrounds, cafeteria, and hallways
- >Communicates how it works
