We're working to calm traffic in your neighborhood and keep kids walking and biking to Denny Middle School and Chief Sealth High School safe by adding speed humps on all streets that are signed with a 20 mph school speed zone. This includes 27th Ave SW, SW Kenyon St and 26th Ave SW. Speed cushions will also be installed along SW Thistle St within the 20 mph school speed zone.

Speed humps decrease the speeds of people driving to under the neighborhood speed limit – 20 mph. Across the city, we want to increase the number of kids who walk and bike to school. Speed cushions are like speed humps but have breaks that allow emergency vehicles to pass through them without slowing down.

We plan to install speed humps as soon as this spring. Prior to construction, you may see the speed hump locations marked on the street. Look for no parking signs at least 3 days before construction, which takes about 2 days.
